COURSE OBJECTIVES

Sociology is the science of social life. Social life encompasses everything humans do with or with reference to each other, including loving and hating, buying and selling, creating and criticizing, bonding and separating, blaming and praising. All of this can be studied scientifically – by creating and testing ideas and developing theories.

This course introduces you to Sociology. By the end of the course you will understand:

- The scope of sociology;
- Some of the principal long-term patterns in the evolution of human societies;
- Some of the principal medium-term patterns in the evolution of western societies, especially the United States;
- The logic underlying several of the most important forms of sociological theory.

READINGS

There is no text book for the course. Instead I have assembled a packet of readings to accompany the lectures. These readings are on E-reserve at the Main Library.
